



FRIDRIHS KONRADI

(Born in 1881, Saka parish; died in 1946, Germany)

Senator of the Civil Cassation Department of the Senate (1928–1939)

Education: *Moscow University, Faculty of Law.*

Before the Senate: *Trainee in the Riga Regional Court and the Court Chamber in Petersburg; Magistrate in Vidzeme and Kurzeme provinces; Judge in the Court Chamber.*

After the Senate: *In 1939 he left for Germany.*

Additional information: *Member of the State Audit Office and Chair of its special sitting; Legal Adviser to the Ministry of Justice and Adviser to the Estonian Ministry of Justice. He has arranged "Excerpts from Judgments of the Civil Cassation Department of the Senate" in 14 volumes.*
